United States Equestrian Federation

Life, senior active and junior active members shall be eligible to participate in all classes at Regular Competitions, Evening Competitions at the Preliminary Level or above and Combined Driving Competitions at the Advanced Level, Dressage, Reining and Vaulting Competitions and Endurance Rides. A nonmember may participate as a handler, rider, driver, owner, lessee, agent, coach or trainer at Regular Competitions, Evening Competitions, Dressage Competitions, Reining Competitions and Combined Driving Competitions upon payment of a \$30 Show Pass fee. Participants in the following classes are exempted from the Requirements of this rule: 1) leadline; 2) exhibitions; 3) games and races; 4) classes for 4-H members; 5) walk trot and academy classes (academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program); 6) USDF introductory level tests, pas de deux and quadrille classes; 7) NRHA Endorsed Reining Competitions. 8) Opportunity classes, 9) citizens of other nations who have proof, in English, of current membership in good standing of their own National Federation, 10) USEA beginner novice division; and 11) assistant handlers in Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes.

Federation Entry Agreement

By entering a Federation-licensed Competition and signing this entry blank as the Owner, Lessee, Trainer, Manager, Agent, Coach, Driver, Rider, Handler, Vaulteer or Longeur and on behalf of myself and my principals, representatives, employees and agents, I agree that I am subject to the Bylaws and Rules of The United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (the "Federation") and the local rules of the competition. I agree to be bound by the Bylaws and Rules of the Federation and of the competition. I will accept as final the decision of the Hearing Committee on any question arising under the Rules, and agree to release and hold harmless the competition, the Federation, their officials, directors and employees for any action taken under the Rules. I represent that I am eligible to enter and/or participate under the Rules, and every horse I am entering is eligible as entered. I also agree that as a condition of and in consideration of acceptance of entry, the Federation and/or the competition may use or assign photographs, videos, audios, cablecasts, broadcasts, internet, film, new media or other likenesses of me and my horse taken during the course of the competition for the promotion, coverage or benefit of the competition, sport, or the Federation. Those likenesses shall not be used to advertise a product and they may not be used in such a way as to jeopardize amateur status. I hereby expressly and irrevocably waive and release any rights in connection with such use, including any claim to compensation, invasion of privacy, right of publicity, or to misappropriation. The construction and application of Federation rules are governed by the laws of the State of New York, and any action instituted against the Federation must be filed in New York State. See GR908.4.

GR407.1-3: For every horse participating in any competition licensed by the Federation, a \$16 Federation Fee will be collected (\$8 shall be an Equine Drugs & Medication Fee to provide for research, inspection & enforcement of rules regarding use of medications and drugs.

Entries

ENTRIES CLOSE the Thursday preceding each show at 3:00 pm. All horses entered must be named on the entry blank including horses shown only in equitation where the rider is being judged. Entry blanks will be accepted ONLY when signed by the owner, rider or handler AND trainer. Entries received after the closing deadline will incur a one time late charge of \$20. Entries submitted online will be accepted until 8:00 pm Thursday without incurring a late charge. MANAGEMENT RESERVES THE RIGHT TO CHARGE A NON-SHOWING FEE OF \$60 TO ANY HORSE NOT ACCUMULATING ENTRY FEES OF \$60.

Stabling

\$95 per stall/tack stall. Stalls are of temporary construction, in permanent buildings or tents. Stalls are 10'x10' with stall doors provided. Stalls are sold strictly on a first come first served basis. No stall will be reserved without payment. Please send stall reservations in early to ensure enough stalls are available. Contact Jenniffer at 614-496-5222 for all stabling needs.

Stalls will be available at 9:00 am on Thursday. Stalls must be vacated by 9:00 pm on Sunday.

A Haul-In fee will be charged for all competitors showing out of their trailer at \$25 per day. All trailers must park in approved areas. Haul-In Exhibitors must check in at the show office before schooling/showing.

Motorized Vehicles

Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent(s), legal guardian(s), or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for sanctions against the parent(s), guardian(s) and/or trainer(s) who are responsible for the child committing the offense. Penalties may include exclusion of the child, parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition and charges being filed against any of the above individuals in accordance with Chapter 6. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

Jump Order

A rotating jump order will be established with the starter. Exhibitors must check in with the Starter to establish order of go. In some instances management may utilize a posted order of go. Orders will be posted at least 1 hour before the start of a class. If you have a ring conflict, you must check with the starter to determine how to resolve the conflict. Remember, it is YOUR responsibility to ensure that you are on the starters list and that you show up for your class on time.

Refunds

No Stall Fees Will Be Refunded. Entry fees will not be refunded unless a certificate of illness or injury prepared by an accredited veterinarian is presented to the secretary before the start of the show. Once the show has started, horses which are not shown in classes which they have entered forfeit their entry fees, unless the horse has been scratched in the show office on an official scratch form prior to the start of the class. If a horse is injured or becomes ill prior to the class or classes entered, proper notification of the scratch must be made in the show office and be accompanied by a certificate from a veterinarian.

Credentials

NO NUMBERS WILL BE RELEASED UNTIL PROPER CREDENTIALS AND ALL SIGNATURES ARE IN ORDER.

All exhibitors must have their current membership cards with them or a copy thereof, or send a copy of their card with their entry blank. All exhibitors in the Pony and Junior Hunter sections must present their measurement cards at the office before numbers will be released. All Pony or Junior Hunters who do not possess a current measurement card will be measured at a time and place to be announced. PLEASE INCLUDE COPIES OF MEASUREMENT CARDS WITH ENTRIES TO FACILITATE PROCESSING. All exhibitors in Amateur sections must present their amateur certification at the office before numbers will be released. PLEASE INCLUDE COPIES OF AMATEUR CARDS WITH ENTRIES TO FACILITATE PROCESSING.

Administration Fee

An administration fee of \$30.00 per horse will be charged.

PLEASE TAKE NOTE

A processing fee of \$75.00 plus collection fees will be made for any Non-negotiable checks.

Non-showing horses whether stabled on the grounds, or hauling in may be assessed a fee of \$60.00 in addition to stabling charges.

Prize Money will be credited to each exhibitor's account. Any credit due will be mailed within 30 days following each show. No prize money will be mailed unless owner's (or other designated payee's) social security number and complete address are listed on the entry blank.

Any exhibitor leaving the grounds before settling their bill in the office may be charged a \$75 fee.

All Major credit cards are accepted as a form of payment. A \$15 service fee per horse will apply to accounts settled by credit card.

Medical Waste

In accordance with the 1989 Federal Waste Tracking Act, which restricts the disposal of medical waste, bio-hazardous medical waste containers will be provided in the stable area. All exhibitors and their agents are responsible for the proper disposal of all medical waste.

Add/Scratch RDNE

SAME DAY ADDS WILL BE ACCEPTED WITH A CHARGE OF \$5 PER CLASS. Please ensure that all of your adds are submitted before the horse show office closes the day before you intend to show. Online adds (if available) will be accepted until 8:00 pm the day prior to the scheduled class. There will be no fee for scratching any class if scratched prior to the start of the class. RDNE Rode Did Not Enter fee of \$25 per occurrence will be charged to all horses showing in a class in which they have not previously been entered. Per USEF rules, horses will not be eligible for an award in the class if they were not added prior to the start of the class.

Rules and Regulations

EVERY CLASS OFFERED HEREIN WHICH IS COVERED BY THE RULES AND SPECIFICATIONS OF THE CURRENT USEF RULE BOOK WILL BE CONDUCTED AND JUDGED IN ACCORDANCE THEREWITH.

All questions not covered in these rules and regulations shall be decided by the show management whose decision shall be final.

Every horse entered for competition will comply with the rules of the horse show management, but management will, in no case, be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur, and it shall be condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold this horse show and the officials and employees of the show blameless for any loss or accident to his horse, employees, equipment, which may occur from sickness, fire or otherwise.

The management reserves the right to refuse, accept conditionally, or to cancel any entries, disqualify any riders or exhibitors, prohibit entries and cancel award prizes without claims for damages; to cancel or combine unfilled classes, or to reschedule classes after due notice to exhibitors; to change rings or rotate judges.

Exhibitors are notified that any act of discourtesy or disobedience to the judges or officials, on the part of the owner, manager, rider, or groom shall disqualify the horse, and the owner shall forfeit his entry fee and other fees. Show management reserves to itself the power to prohibit any person from attending or showing a horse in the ring and to remove any groom or horse from the show without being liable for compensation.

It is the tradition of the show that riders be correctly attired for the class in question, that attendants be neatly dressed and the horses properly presented. Management may in its discretion bar any person from entering the ring if not suitable presented to appear before an audience.

Management

Management reserves the right to cancel or combine classes if insufficient entries warrant. Where USEF Rules do not apply, it is our policy to combine classes with 4 or fewer entries. Management reserves the right to refuse any entry. The Equivents Horse Show, its officers, officials and employees will not be responsible for any accident or loss which may occur to an exhibitor, spectator, guest, rider, groom, attendant or other employee, animal or equipment at the show. THIS SHALL BE A CONDITION OF ENTRY TO THE SHOWS OR SHOW GROUNDS.

Management reserves the right to change scheduled class locations or start times for any reason, time constraints or any other reason management decides is best for the horses well being and competition.

Coggins

Proof of negative Coggins Test within one year is required of every horse entering Equivents Equestrian Complex. Out of state horses must be accompanied by a current Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (within 30 days). This paperwork must accompany all horses on arrival. Do not send with entries.

Schooling/Longeing

The Show Rings will be available for schooling from 10:00 am until 7:00 pm on Thursday weather permitting. Ring 2 will be open on Friday from 10 am until 7 pm weather permitting. Flatwork only in the mornings. NO HORSE WILL BE PERMITTED TO SCHOOL UNTIL A SIGNED ENTRY BLANK IS ON FILE IN THE OFFICE

It is compulsory for riders in all Hunter, Jumper and Hunt Seat Equitation classes where jumping is required and when jumping anywhere on the competition grounds to wear properly fastened protective headgear which meets or exceeds ASTM/SEI standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. It must be properly fitted with harness secured. Boot/shoes worn while riding anywhere on the competition grounds must have a distinguishable heel.

Longeing is not permitted in the show rings at any time. There are designated areas for longeing available

Poling

Manual Poling and the use of Offsets are prohibited at all times on the Show Grounds. In the event of a violation of this regulation, the involved horse and its trainer of record as indicated on the entry blank may be suspended from further competition at this show.

Arenas

Ring 1 is 140'x280'. Ring 2 is 120'x210'. All rings and attached schooling areas are footed with a sand cushion on a limestone base.

Dogs

NEW USEF DOG RULE. Dog owners failing to comply with this rule must/will be issued a Yellow warning card by the steward or any competition official. Dogs are not permitted to be loose on competition grounds at any time and must be held on a leash or otherwise restrained. Individuals must not lead dogs on a leash while mounted. Dog owners are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from their dogs' behaviors. Immediately following the receipt by the Federation of a third Yellow Warning Card indicating that a competitor, spectator, or participant has been issued three (3) Yellow Warning Cards within a (16) month period the Executive Director shall either levy a fine ranging from \$500 to \$1000 or a formal Charge pursuant to this Rule and GR604 alleging that the rules have been violated on all or any one of said three occasions pursuant to Chapter 6 of the Rules.

All Hunters

Courses will simulate fences found in the hunting field such as: brush, wall, in-and-out, oxers, post & rails, gate, aiken and panels. In some classes the area of the Courtesy Circle may be restricted by a mandatory line. This line will be indicated on the course diagram and a corresponding barrier will be erected in the ring. All classes will be judged on performance and soundness unless otherwise noted. Trophy and eight ribbons will be presented in each hunter class unless otherwise noted. A Champion and Reserve Champion title will be awarded to two of the four horses acquiring the most points over fences in each hunter section. In addition to these points, only these four horses will receive full points for one under saddle class. Full Championship points will be given in all classes in each hunter section, unless otherwise stated.

Equus Foundation/USEF Best Performance

The Best Performance Competition (BPC) is a competitive awards program endorsed by the USEF that is open to Junior, Amateur, and Professional competitors in all divisions at participating USEF Recognized horse shows. The underlying mission of this joint effort of the United States Equestrian Federation and the EQUUS Foundation is to reward competitive excellence and encourage education, awareness, and philanthropic support of horse welfare. In order to compete, exhibitors enter one of the four BPC classes (Best Junior on a Pony, Best Junior on a Horse, Best Amateur, and Best Professional) at the participating show. Upon entering, exhibitors will receive an official EQUUS Foundation BPC armband from the show office and will wear the armband while competing. The winners are the exhibitors who, in the opinion of the judges, exhibit the best overall competitive performance at the show and accumulate points based on the number of class entries at the show in the official USEF BPC standings.
